

# Enchanted Potions

Become a Potion Master!

Use these potion recipes with common ingredients to make magical (kid safe) potions with a little fizz, foam, and a lot of fabulous chemistry fun!

Supplies:

- Cups, jars, or flasks
- Spoons to stir
- Ribbons & charms



The following page has 4 unique potions you can try and make. Some will bubble, others will sparkle, and some will make fun colors!

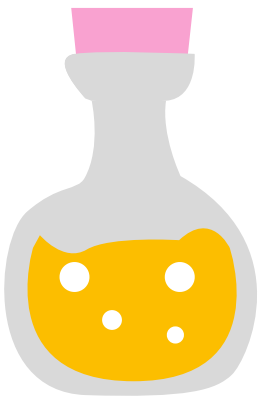
Practice the scientific method by thinking of a **hypothesis** before you mix each potion – a guess – what do you think will happen?

For all of the potion recipes, you can decorate a jar, flask, or test tube with a ribbons and charms, or draw on it with sparkling paint pens to make it more magical!

To make it more advanced, try mixing different amounts of the ingredients and see what happens!

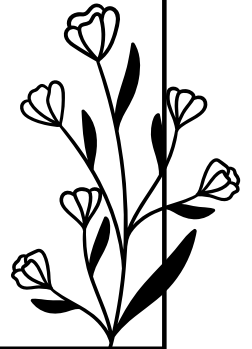
### Fizzy Fairy Elixir

- Mix 1-2 parts of baking soda and 1 part of citric acid in a container
- Fill a separate container with water and add food coloring (if desired)
- Pour the water into the powder mixture and see what happens!



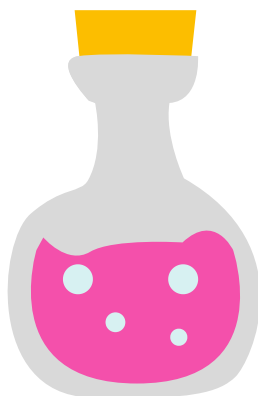
### Princess Sparkle Potion

- Add distilled water to a container with a lid
- Mix in edible luster powder and optionally add food coloring
- Tighten the lid all the way and then shake and swirl your magic potion!



### Molten Magic Serum

- Fill a jar about 1/3 of the way with water and food coloring
- Add about the same amount of vegetable oil (don't fill up the jar)
- Drop in glitter and Antacid tablets (like Alka-Seltzer) and watch!



### Chromatic Concoction

- In a cup, add food coloring to water
- In another cup, mix 2 tbs of sugar into warm water with a different color food coloring, until dissolved
- Pour the two cups of water into a new jar and watch the colors blend!
